
Coastal Zone Film Permit Type by Number of Days

Timeframe - The number of film days allowed out of 180 days according to CZO Section 8175-5.6.1.1



There are two types of film permits that productions can apply for: over-the-counter ministerial film permits and discretionary permits which are subject to an environmental review. The over-the-counter film permits can be issued to allow a maximum of 14 out of 180 days of filming productions activities in the Coastal Zone. Film production activities that exceed 14 film days are required to obtain a discretionary Planned Development Permit.

<u>Filming Production Activities</u> – All uses, structures and activities including but not limited to film production preparation, film production striking, film base camp, and aviation services, that are related to the production of motion pictures, television programming, music and corporate videos, advertisements, web production, and film still photography for sale or use for a commercial purpose. For the purposes of this definition, film production activities do not include permanent film studios. (Coastal Zoning Ordinance definition)

Neighborhood Consent – signed approval from 50%+1 of impacted residents. The noticing radius from the filming activity to the impacted residents is determined by the zoning of the film site.
